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Bill Pangbrun

Bill Pangburn studied fine arts at the Phillips-Universitaet, Marburg an der Lahn, Germany; Tulane University (BA), New Orleans, LA; and Pratt Institute (MFA), Brooklyn, NY.

Pangburn, a longtime resident of Tribeca, New York's venerable art neighborhood, belongs to the tradition of the New York School. Sixty years old, he represents the still-vital energies of a legacy some might feel is moribund. While Pangburn has some connection with the Abstract-Expressionist legacy, he remains his own person—a necessary stance if an artist's work is related to a practice that was established in the middle of the last century. In a post-postmodern environment, pluralism holds sway, and a major criterion for success in art has to do with maintaining the excellence of a chosen style. The trick is to maintain a balance between the old and the new, and this is something the artist does extremely well.





















Artist Statement



I bike alongside the Hudson River daily. This affords me a view of the river, its waves, currents, and flow. Daily differences occur, of course, as the weather and natural forces affect the water, but the flow persists. In one sense this experience is routine, mundane, and familiar. I peddle and the river flows. Yet, I do perceive a connection through a communion in repetition. Both the river and I are driven daily by our respective forces, moving our respective matter, and both of us are never the same despite our repetitions. Eternity and transience dance hand in hand. Against this, however, is the knowledge of the river's pollution and the destruction of the ecosystem that civilization has wrought. Our dominion is becoming our demise. We are at a tipping point as the metaphysics of the natural world slip through our fingers, leaving us only a view of a ravaged world built upon our own exploitations. While I am very much involved with questions of self-awareness, I am also fully cognizant of the finite and immediate aspects of our existence. I find that I must live with both perspective and I attempt to address them with different aspects of the work that I do.
